

@EQEXPLAIN

The **value or string parameter** attribute @EQEXPLAIN is used to show the description instead of the values (for instance in a combobox). Furthermore, enables for normal value to present the EXEXPLAIN text instead of the value itself. See also [@EQCOMBOEXPLAIN](#), [@EQEXPLAIN_TELITAB](#) and [@EXEXPLAINVALUE](#).

Syntax

Place @EQEXPLAIN or @EQEXPLAIN:StringValue in the data slot of the parameter

Arguments

- StringValue is the text to be displayed

Remarks

The attribute can be used to provide a string to be presented as alternative to the value. In case of comboboxes (using [EQ](#) combinations in the reference of a parameter) you can use this attribute to present the text that corresponds with a value which is not presented. For instance, the parameter contains the following in the reference:

Option:
0<EQ>No
1<EQ>Yes
